Camera Update

Dear GEMS Families,

As we enter week 8 of school, we are learning more about how to effectively serve our students virtually. Some challenges with attendance, class participation, and behavior have led us to make the decision to require all students in grades five through eight to have their cameras on and have their first and last name listed during synchronous class sessions. Teachers will remind students during class to turn on their cameras and keep them on. Students who do not keep their cameras on during classes may be dismissed from class resulting in an unexcused absence. Our goal is to keep our students safe, engaged, and learning.

If your student has a laptop without a working camera, please contact the office to let us know and to arrange pick up for a GEMS laptop with a working camera. The office staff will notify teachers if a student's camera is not working properly and they will be permitted to participate in class until they receive a GEMS laptop with a working camera. Communication is key to this process. If your student has any challenges with their camera or participating in synchronous Zoom classes in general, please let us know and we will work together to find a solution.



Grade Level Updates

This month we are adding the letters C, N, M, R, V, and S to our alphabet. We will also be learning the High Frequency Words: the, in, & he. In math we are counting up to ten, learning how to use the words "more than" "fewer than" and "same as" to describe groups, and learning how to find out if we have "enough". For Expedition, we will begin our final unit of Toy Preferences. In Unit 1, we learned attribute words to describe toys. In Unit 2 we worked on Speaking and Listening skills as well as writing skills addressing what toys each student preferred. In Unit 3 we will cover the Speaking & Listening and Writing standards while we discuss what Classroom Toys our classmates prefer.

1st

Graders have been working hard as readers, writers, and mathematicians! During Expeditions, we've continued our study of how tools help us do important work while closely reading, The Most Magnificent Thing by Ashley Spires. We are getting excited to use our knowledge of tools to help us design and create an object that is needed at home or in our classroom!

Our mathematicians began solving new types of story problems using the relationship between addition and subtraction. We will continue to develop an understanding of the meaning of the equal sign and connect story problems to equations!

2nd Graders have been busy studying why schools are important in Expedition! This month, we will begin studying schools around the world; the challenges they face and how they overcome those challenges.

> In Crew, we are learning to identify our emotions using the zones of regulation. We are also discovering strategies that we can use to regulate our bodies when we start to feel out of control. In math, students have begun exploring place value and have been finding different strategies to add and subtract numbers with regrouping!

Graders have started unit two in our expeditions/modules. We are learning about the challenges people face all over the world when trying to access books.

Our Mathematicians are diving right into multiplication by working with equal groups.

This month our goals are to increase participation and work submission, and consistently having our camera's on!

Graders are navigating their way through Schoology with a Scavenger Hunt, they are strengthening reading and writing skills in Expeditions and ALL Block, and they are working with fractions in math. Through all of this they are showing great CHAMPS protocol, earning lots of HERO points, and treating others with respect in our virtual learning environment.

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Grade Level Updates

5th

Graders are diving deeply into our rights as humans and studying how human rights can be upheld or taken away. We are using the novel Esperanza Rising to study not only human rights, but the importance of those human rights in cultures outside of our own. Students are also learning about the planets and their roles in our solar system as well as volume in science and math classes.

6th

Graders are continuing to look at our guiding question "How do humans impact their environment?" In humanities, students are reading Flush and learning about ancient civilizations and their geography. Students are learning about energy, rocks, minerals, and renewable vs. nonrenewable resources in science.

7th

Graders are diving deeper into the question "How does a point in time shape the present and the future?" In humanities, students are completing their study of All American Boys and beginning to look at how colonization shaped the beginning of America.

8th

Graders are looking deeper at the sources of our food and answering the guestion, "How do we feed a growing population"? In humanities, students are reading the Omnivore's Dilemma to explore different food supply chains. In science, students are learning the genetics of food. In math, students have been exploring exponents, roots and scientific notation. As we begin the second quarter, students will be looking at the prices of various foods used to make their own family recipes. Students will use this information to demonstrate their understanding of solving equations.

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Grade Level Updates

K-4th Art

Currently in art 2nd, 3rd, and 4th graders are learning about repetition, rhythm, and pattern while creating portraits in the style of either Wadsworth Jarrell or April Sunami. We are building on our knowledge of shapes and lines to carefully draw each part of the face. Students are focusing on the habit of quality by filling their white space, taking their time, and adding details.

K-4th Music

This month we are finishing our first guarter of music. Kindergarten and First grade have been working on recognizing things they hear in music and how to demonstrate musical opposites. We have been listening to and mapping out music that we hear from around the world.

PE & Health

In Physical Education, 6th and 8th graders have been learning about Fitness and working to improve their fitness. Students have learned how fitness improves health, learned about the components of fitness, evaluated their fitness, practiced fitness activities, and have started creating a personal fitness plan. Students will follow their plan and evaluate their progress through the semester.

First grade students in Ms. Bush's class are participating in a reading of The Most Magnificent Thing. They are learning how to dig deeper into the meaning of the words and sentences they read. Showing the emotions of the

little girl in the book is fun as well!

RESIDENCY VERIFICATION NOTIFICATION

Per House Bill 21 community schools are now required to perform a monthly review of student files and randomly select families for residency verification.
