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This month in skills block students will continue to learn about long and short vowel sounds and will begin to focus on writing sentences. In modules, we will begin to learn about living and non-living things with a focus on plants and what they need to survive. Students will continue to practice writing and solving addition number sentences in math and will begin to learn about subtraction.

Graders are working hard as researchers this month. We will read multiple texts and look closely at pictures and videos to find out how birds use their feathers and their beaks to survive. In labs, we are using the Explore Lab to learn more about how birds use their feathers. We are using the Imagine Lab to recreate birdhouses and even create body parts of birds with our materials. This month, our Habits of Learning goal is to make expected choices instead of unexpected choices (Responsibility).


Graders have begun working in their expert groups to learn about specific butterflies. In math, we are working on repeated addition and making groups to introduce multiplication. We are still teaching social skills and the importance of reading using Women's History texts. We have begun teaching small groups in skills

block based on mid-year data.





Graders have loved our unit study of Peter Pan so far! The pirates, mermaids, flying, and magic are all super fun and we are loving that we get to read every single day! The students also did an amazing job with their black history month projects where they chose one of our black history month figures, researched them, drafted a short report, and then got to type it! We're hoping that we can do more of these projects in the future. In math, we have begun our study of area including figuring out that multiplying the sides together will give us the area in square units. The class is truly doing a great job with



Graders are hard at work as they enter the final trimester before fifth grade. We recently kicked off a module on the Revolutionary War and are examining the issues of the times through the lenses of the Patriots, Loyalists, Slaves and Native Americans. In math we are studying fractions. We have learned how to find equivalent fractions and will move towards comparing fractions with different denominators. Lastly, we have started preparing for passages. We are excited to show our community and families how much we have learned this year!

Graders to future 4th Graders!

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Art: This March in Art, students are working with a wide variety of materials! After reading "The Very Hungry Caterpillar", kindergarteners are creating their own "hungry caterpillars" out of clay. First Grade read the book "Tar Beach", and they are making fabric collage scenes based on the work of the illustrator. Second Grade is drafting their butterfly study drawings and Third Grade is finishing their frog trading cards. Fourth graders learned about Aboriginal art from Australia, and will be creating their own aboriginal-themed prints.









Music: In music this trimester all classes are starting a unit on the Ukulele. We will be exploring the history of and how to play the ukulele. To start our unit off we learned about each part of the ukulele, and what it does. Now we are using "basket ukuleles" with rubber bands on them to learn how to properly pluck and strum the strings. Then we are moving on to the real deal and learning to practice and perform songs.

P.E.: Our school is participating in our annual Jump Rope Program for the AHA and issuing out a Kids Heart Challenge! The students are learning new jump rope skills and different ways to keep their hearts and minds healthy. This is a fun and exciting event for our entire school as we work together to raise donations for the American Heart Association, earn new equipment for Physical Education, and save lives together!

knowledge about ecosystem to learn about bird migration with a game where we pretended to be birds and went on a bird hike to identify different types of birds!








6th

Students completed their stairs project in math where they assessed the safety of the various staircases around the school using their knowledge of math concepts like; slope, graphing, and equations. In English, they started their expedition novels based on wartime events to gain different perspectives which will lead to their final products where they will interview veterans from The Ohio Veterans Hall

of Fame.

Attendance Attention Parents/Guardians *Attendance*

Attending school daily is critical to student success. Ohio's new House Bill 410 law requires a preventative approach to excessive student absences. An Attendance Team has been established to work with our students and families to help improve daily attendance. Note* - Missing as few as 2 days per month is considered chronically absent! We want to see your student in school every day!

** REMINDER ** RESIDENCY VERIFICATION NOTIFICATION

Per House Bill 21 community schools are now required to perform a monthly review of student files and randomly select families for residency verification.

Please be aware you could be randomly selected to provide proof of residency during one of the required monthly random selections. Proof of residency would need to be turned in to the school within two weeks of the request. The following documents would satisfy the needs of the residency verification:

- A deed, mortgage, lease, current home owner's or renter's insurance declaration page, or current real property tax bill.
- A utility bill or receipt of utility installation issued within the last 90 days.
- A paycheck or paystub issued to the parent or student within the last 90 days that includes the address of the parent's or student's primary residence.
- The most current available bank statement issued to parent or student that includes the address of the parent's or student's primary residence.
- Any other official document issued to the parent or student that includes the address of the parent's or student's primary residence.

IF EVIDENCE IS NOT PROVIDED REQUESTS FOR ADDITIONAL DOCUMENTATION OR A HOME VISIT MAY OCCUR.
