Ohio's State Tests - December 4-13

Ohio's State Tests will be administered December 4-13. <u>A letter will be given to your student during Crew the week of November 18 if your student needs to test in December.</u> This administration is for students currently enrolled in American Government and students who have previously taken any of the state tests but not achieved a proficient score. Students can prepare for the tests by going to <u>bit.ly/AIR-resources</u> to take practice tests. Students not taking the Ohio State Tests will follow a regular schedule. Students who miss a class for testing will be given the opportunity to make up any missed classwork and assignments.

TCS@ODU Students Attend TECHCORPShack Coding Event

This event gave high school students the opportunity to learn about computer science in a fun, engaging and inclusive environment. Students learned how to use MIT App Inventor to explore the world of mobile app development and create an app that tackles a real-world need or problem. A total of 200 high school students will participate in 1.5 day hackathons in Akron, Columbus, Dayton, and Zanesville. Evan Smith and his team won best app!

TCS@ODU Students Start a Community Garden

Ms. Riley's Community Leadership Conference (CLC) class is building a community garden at TCS@ODU to practice sustainability and learn important skills around food sovereignty. They are building soil from the ground up using mulch and no til gardening, composting, and worm bins. They are also utilizing rainwater harvesting, seed saving and plant propagation to teach students how to provide nutritious food for themselves and their communities at little to no cost to themselves.

In the spring, a group of TCS@ODU students chosen from the CLC class will travel to the national CLC conference in Flint, Michigan to share our projects and actions with other young activists. TCS@ODU are the only representatives for the whole state of Ohio! This year students are focusing on sustainability and how we will survive, adapt and thrive 100 years into the future.








Rollercoaster Project

Students in Ms. Zuniga's class were asked to build a rollercoaster with a project budget of 6,000,000 in mock money. Students chose their groups and signed a work contract allowing each other to be fired if everyone didn't fulfill their given work title: Treasurer, Secretary, PR and Advertising Specialist, or Lead Architect. First, they needed to design a business proposal in which they stated approximately what their project would cost and created concept art. Students were to design their rollercoaster around an elected central theme. They payed each other's salaries, considered storage costs, cleaning costs, insurance, and consultation fees should they seek help from someone outside of their group. There were also two plot twists in the project in which anything could happen and they needed to have room in their budget for it. Each week we checked in with students through their Friday Meetings. They kept track of their meeting minutes and report back to Ms. Zuniga about their progress on the project. They've done such great work. Through budget keeping, project management, conflict resolution, and business operations our students are hitting a plethora of learning competencies everyday!





RESIDENCY VERIFICATION NOTIFICATION

Per House Bill 21 community schools are now required to perform a monthly review of student files and randomly select families for residency verification. If evidence is not provided, requests for additional documentation or a home visit may occur.
